EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

We approach 2008 fiscal year with great hope and anticipation to do more for the Lord in the Ministry of God's Word to our constituency-Malawi. Malawi has experienced impressive economic growth and the availability of sufficient maize supplies is of great relief as we seek to meet the Spiritual food of our people.

The main focus in 2008 is to meaningfully reach out to our people and helping them engage with the Scriptures. We shall seek to implement strategies that will lead us to being self-reliant. The four translation projects continue to be expense centers without income generation; but they will be the main focus for our local fundraising drive.

We are starting a small office in Lilongwe with one person manning it and the annual cost has been pegged at MWK1.3 million. We intend to use this office to get closer to the people as we see using agencies conflicting greatly when an issue of their priorities and settling accounts comes in.

We shall continue to strengthen the critical partnerships with the Church and other agencies with similar ideals. We shall work hard to develop and harness these partnerships because they in turn will help us to move the Scriptures to where the people are. Operation Berea shall be reinvigorated. Our relationship with World Vision Malawi, Scripture Union, the Students' Christian Organization of Malawi (SCOM), Life Ministry, and Evangelical Association of Malawi through the pastors fraternal, the Christian Council of Malawi etc shall be consolidated. Our cooperation with the Hosanna/American Bible Society and Scotland shall also be strengthened as we execute specific projects in the Faith Comes By Hearing area.

We shall ensure that the Faith Comes By Hearing Programme continue to add value to our total work by helping the part time colporteurs to represent us in both selling scriptures in their various districts and enlisting members for the Society. The fees for setting up these listening groups shall go towards the general running expenses of the programme.

The Desk Top Publishing unit has been challenged to be resourceful and generate income. We shall be doing jobs from the outside world in typesetting cards and celebration events and also do small scale printing as a way of raising funds for running the unit first and the work as a whole. We aim to develop the Unit to be a main source of income in coming years as much as it helps in the timely processing of our manuscripts for further printing.

We shall endeavor to reach out to the TAZI audience with specially designed Scriptures. This is a pilot project emanating from the Associate Director's participation in a TAZI workshop in UK in 2006. The cost of the project shall be met from a special fund that the UBS has setup and we hope this will grow in the succeeding years as well.

The HIV/AIDS programme will be renewed with greater emphasis on the outreach to the young people through the Take Charge and other video productions that have been made. "Where is the Good Samaritan project?" is another approach that we shall use. The National Aids Commission (NAC) shall be approached with another proposal which shall be an addendum to this budget when approved.

The Staff welfare shall be boosted by operating the MASM scheme from January 2008. The Society shall pay 80% of the contributions and staff shall pay 20% as in the current practice. We feel this shall help to cover our members more meaningfully as the expenditure shall be foreseen and accommodated on a month to month basis.

We are proposing to develop a local pension scheme where the Society shall contribute 12.5% and staff 10%. We will dialogue with the UBS so that a proper transition is made so that staff not yet retired are able to access their previous year's cover transferred into the new scheme which shall be managed locally.

We have put a strategy in place to help us have most of the Scriptures in good time and be able to pay for them before the year ends so that we can generate the required cash to run the operations with ease and flow with the life of the Church and its members with zeal.

Prayer shall be an under gird for all we shall do. We make plans being mindful and realizing that God is our helper in execution. To him and him alone are praise honor and glory now and time without end Amen!
